Murray Kenyon is Cybersecurity Partnership Executive in Information Security Services at U.S. Bank, the fifth largest commercial bank in the United States. He fosters value-added relationships with Industry, Government, and Academic partners; leads participation in organizations addressing the cybersecurity challenges facing the nation; represents U.S. Bank in trade associations and as U.S. Bank's executive representative to the Financial Services Sector Coordinating Council (FSSCC). Prior to his current position, Murray was the Bank's Cybersecurity Workforce Development Executive, where he established the Information Security Workforce Development program.

Murray is a seasoned executive leader with experience in the Federal Government and Private Sector, leading national initiatives in cybersecurity, intelligence operations, information sharing, and critical infrastructure protection. Prior to joining U.S. Bank, he was Senior Vice President for Technology Risk Management at BITS, the technology security division of the Bank Policy Institute. At BITS, he led member institutions in addressing cyber preparedness, information and technology sharing, shaping cybersecurity legislation and regulation, Cross-Sector and Public-Private engagement, and convening experts to solve cybersecurity problems facing the Financial Sector.

Before entering the Private Sector, Murray served for 33 years in analytic, staff, and leadership positions at the National Security Agency (NSA), including over 10 years in the Defense Intelligence Senior Executive Service. His varied roles included intelligence analysis, operational and technical management, inter-agency and international liaison, cyber threat information sharing, stakeholder engagement, and overseeing national policy for the secure operation of Federal Government IT and communications systems. As NSA Senior Executive Account Manager for the Financial Sector, he organized technical assistance to Law Enforcement responding to cyber incidents in the Private Sector, led NSA participation in Public-Private cybersecurity exercise programs, and worked with DHS to educate industry executives on the nation-state cyber threat.

Murray received his B.A. in Spanish from Asbury University and earned M.S. degrees from the National Intelligence University (Strategic Intelligence) and the National Defense University/National War College (National Security Strategy). He is on Cybersecurity advisory boards for several universities and the National Cybersecurity Training and Education Center, and also serves on the Policy Council of the National Technology Security Coalition and the Board of Directors of the National Cybersecurity Alliance.
